## women RA 9372 or the Human Security Act

"The State recognizes that the fight against terrorism requires a <u>comprehensive</u> approach, comprising political, economic, diplomatic, military and legal means duly taking into account the root causes of terrorism with acknowledging these as justifications for terrorist and/or criminal activities. Such measures include conflict management and post-conflict peace building, addressing the root causes of conflict by building state capacity and promoting equitable economic development." (Sec. 2)

- Abu Sayyaf Group (BaSulTa)
- Rajah Sulaiman Movement (South Cotabato, BaSulTa)
  - Bangsamoro Islamic Freedom Fighters (*Maguindanao, Central Mindanao*)
  - Maute Group (Lanao)

### 2017 Marawi Siege

- 168 civilian deaths
- > 350,000 IDPs (49% male, 51% female)
- Cost of war: PhP 5 billion
