

Aid Effectiveness & Allocation

- Role of politics in explaining aid allocation (Alesina & Dollar 2000; Boone 1996; Lancaster 2000; 2008)
- Relationships between the donor and recipient country
- Domestic political variables are absent (Alesina & Dollar 2000; Boone 1996)
- Role of Politics is cast at the international level

State Diplomatic Policy & Aid Motivation


- How government foreign policy actually affects
 ODA in a same state?
- "State's motivations involve individuals and can be difficult to observe" (Lancaster 2008)
- Political parties and domestic political institutions play an important part; parties make a difference (Thrien and Noel 2000)




Results: President Kim's visits to Southeast Asia and attendance at ASEAN Meetings




Results: President Roh's visits to Southeast Asia and attendance at ASEAN Meetings

Results: President Park's visits to Southeast Asia and attendance at ASEAN Meetings




