
 Your central entry point and easy access to European research and innovation

How can you participate in Horizon 2020?

There are two ways to participate:

Participation of individual researchers

Researchers of all nationalities are welcome to participate

Collaborative projects

Include at least 3 legal entities from 3 different countries of the EU or from Countries Associated to Horizon 2020



Where in Horizon 2020 can you find funds for individual research?

- The European Research Council (ERC)
 - = excellent research
- Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions (MSCA)
 - = mobility of researchers and technical staff







These opportunities are for researchers who want to work in Europe.



How to participate in a collaborative project?

- As a legal entity from Philippines you can take part in collaborative projects of Horizon 2020
- You can receive funding
- You can even coordinate a project

Remember! All proposals must meet certain minimum conditions:

- √ 3 participants from different EU member states or Associated Countries
- ✓ You as an international partner must come in addition to this minimum



Automatically funded:

- Member States
- Associated Countries
- Countries listed in Annex A of the Work Programme



Other Partner Countries are funded when:

- Agreement exists between 2 funding bodies
- Provision made in the call text
- Commission deems participation essential

CRISEA - The Story

The Challenge

- So far, the European Union has lacked a strategic approach towards the Asia-Pacific region, despite strong economic interests and heightened security concerns in the area
- Several EU Member States have adopted an active bilateral approach towards key partners, but the European Union has mostly failed to speak with one voice in relevant fora

The Solving Approach

- CRISEA conducts interdisciplinary research in five areas where regional forces compete: the environment, the economy, the state, identity, and the region.
- Three transversal themes migration, gender and security are examined within each Work Package
- To reach out to the widest possible audience, CRISEA follows a "dissemination through dialogue" strategy

DREAM - The Story

The Challenge

- The combination of longer life expectancy, evolving socio-economical norms and conditions, and new technologies are dramatically changing life after retirement, and not always for the better
- Pensioners often find themselves with many years in front of them, some of them likely characterized by reduced physical and cognitive abilities and the experience of loneliness and social isolation

The Solving Approach

- Rethinking long life and understanding the socio-economical context that can make this period of life more exiting and attractive
- Enabling older adults of all ages and specifically including adults who cannot leave their home or that have reduced cognitive abilities to learn, grow, interact, and contribute to society through ICT

International participation is targeted by specific programme elements

- Specific topics in calls for proposals may:
 - indicate that participation of International Partners is encouraged
 - indicate that participation of partners from a certain country or region is encouraged or even mandatory

What do Marie Skłodowska-Curie actions (MSCA) offer?

- Opportunities for training and career development
- Mobility of researchers is mandatory

MSCA principles:

- Open to all career stages and nationalities
- Bottom-up approach
- International, inter-sectoral and interdisciplinary career and knowledge-exchange









Four MSCA main funding lines – Part I

Individual Fellowships (IF):

- Supporting experienced international researchers to do research in Europe for 12-36 months
- Host institutions: from academia or industry

Research and Innovation Staff Exchange (RISE):

- International and inter-sectoral cooperation
- Exchange of all types of staff (research, management, administrative and technical)



Four MSCA main funding lines – Part II

Innovative Training Networks (ITN):

 Networks of organisations offering research and training to early-stage researchers

Co-funding of regional, national and international programmes (COFUND):

- COFUND provides funding for funders, stimulating regional, or international programmes
- At all stages of researchers' careers (ESR, ER)



IF: Individual Fellowships

- As an experienced researcher of any nationality you can apply with your individual research project to be conducted at a European organisation
- An individual fellowship provides tailored training for your career in research
- Work contract including social security for 12-36 months
- Possibility to spend 2 years in a TC and one year in Europe
 (Global Fellowships)



RISE: Research and Innovation Staff Exchange

Conditions:

- At least 3 entities from 3 different countries of which 2 should come from different MS and/or AC
- Staff should be engaged in or linked to research and innovation activities for at least one month prior to the secondment
- Duration: Up to 4 years
- Costs covered: Secondment of staff members for one month up to one year



RISE: Research and Innovation Staff Exchange

- As a university, research center or company you can conduct short term staff exchanges within a joint research project.
- Staff of any nationality, employed by the organisations from the network, can participate
- All types of staff are eligible (research, management, administrative or technical)
- Sharing of knowledge and ideas from research to market through trans-border and inter-sectoral collaboration with Europe.



ITN: Innovative Training Networks

- Participation of early-stage researchers in existing joint research training or doctoral programmes of international networks
- Duration: 4 years, any nationality of researchers, funds covering researchers and institutional costs

Societal Challenge 1: Health, demographic change and wellbeing

Budget: € 7,472 billion

- Improve our understanding of the causes and mechanisms underlying health
- Improve our ability to monitor health and to prevent, detect, treat and manage disease
- Support older persons to remain active and healthy
- Test and demonstrate new models and tools for health and care delivery



Societal Challenge 2: Food security, sustainable agriculture and forestry, marine and maritime and inland water research and the Bioeconomy

Budget: € 3,851 billion

- Population growth requires a change in approach to production, consumption, processing, storage and recycling of waste
- Environmental contamination responses
- Agriculture, forestry and industrial sectors of food and bio-based products play an important role in rural development and management of the natural heritage

Societal Challenge 3 : Secure, clean and efficient energy

Budget: € 5,931 billion

- Energy is the driving force of the modern economy maintaining our standard of living requires huge amounts of energy
- As the second largest economy in the world, Europe depends too much on the rest of the world in terms of energy
- The EU has set ambitious climate and energy targets to be achieved



Societal Challenge 4: Smart, green and integrated transport

Budget: € 6,339 billion

- Transportation will boost employment, economic development, welfare and global trade
- Growing connections between individuals and communities
- Reduction of societal dependence on oil stocks
- Reduction of traffic congestion and air pollution, road safety influence on health and quality of life
- Creating a sustainable transport system adaptable to a modern, competitive Europe



Societal Challenge 5: Climate action, environment resource efficiency and raw materials

Budget: € 3,081 billion

- Securing access to raw materials and clean water
- Protection of biodiversity and ecosystems
- Investing in innovative solutions to support a "green" economy that is in harmony with the natural environment
- Tackling climate change as a multidisciplinary priority (35% of the total budget of the program)
- Management of water and waste



Societal Challenge 6: Europe in a changing world - Inclusive innovative and reflective societies

Budget: € 1,309 billion

- Reduce inequalities, promote social fairness and propose solutions for adapted governance structures
- Identify untapped sources of growth and support new forms of innovation (e.g. open innovation, innovation of business models, public sector innovation, social innovation) to meet social needs
- Support research and innovation in European heritage, identity, history and culture
- Strengthen EU's capacities for developing and improving its external action and international cooperation
- Main themes for 2018-2020: migration, transformations in the Industry 4.0 context, governance for the future

Societal Challenge 7: Secure societies – Protecting freedom and security of Europe and its citizens

Budget: € 1,695 billion

- Maintaining public security through
 - combating crime and terrorism
 - protect communities from natural disasters
 - tackling illegal trafficking of people, drugs and counterfeit goods
- Development of new technologies for the protection of citizens
- Respect for privacy and compliance with fundamental rights




Sustainable solutions for bio-based plastics on land and sea

Scope: CE-BG-06-2019

- Activities shall focus on sustainability strategies and solutions for bio-based products and support the Plastics Strategy.
- They shall include innovative product design and business models facilitating efficient reuse and recycling strategies and solutions, including ensuring the safety of recycled materials when used for toys or packaging food stuffs.
- They shall address the technical and economic barriers to biobased plastics recycling as regards established and/or alternative recycling options.
- The risk, impact and solutions to cross-contamination with conventional plastics waste streams or other contaminants shall also be addressed.

Sustainable wood value chains

Scope:

A. [2019] Building with wood:

- Proposals shall develop and test new technologies and environmental friendly solutions for the use of wood-based materials in the (re)construction and/or retrofitting of buildings.
- Proposals should also explore options for building with wood in combination with composite/hybrid materials, linkages with other naturebased solutions, make use of ICT, and consider LCA and carbon accounting, 'environmental documentation' (i.e. product definitions, standards and construction codes), performance standards, public policies and regulations, consumer perception and engagement/co-creation.

B. [2020] Resilient forest systems

The Commission considers that proposals requesting a contribution from the EU of the order of **EUR 10 million for sub-topic A** and **5 million for sub-topic B** would allow this specific challenge to be addressed appropriately. Nonetheless, this does not preclude submission and selection of proposals requesting other amounts.


A vaccine against African swine fever Scope:

SFS-12-2019

- The research proposals will address the necessary steps for developing safe vaccines against ASF for domestic pigs and wild boars.
- Proposals should build on past or ongoing EU funded research and on current knowledge of the characteristics of the viruses and research gaps, with the overall purpose of developing pilot vaccines and their companion DIVA test.
- Activities should address vaccination as part of a control strategy in different scenarios and should consider the potential impact on animal production and trade.
- Particular focus should be put on the European situation and the role
 of wild boars in the spread of the disease, so the proposals should
 address at least the ASF viruses circulating in Europe, and may also
 cover all or the most relevant exotic ones.
- Wild fauna other than wild boars, that are involved in the epidemiology and for which vaccination may help control the disease, may also be addressed.



International cooperation "Open to the world"

Horizon 2020 is **Open to the World**. This means that participants from all over the world, regardless of their place of establishment or residence, can participate in most of the calls of Horizon 2020. Furthermore, in many cases, the EU will fund at least partly the participation of the international partners (see below).

Encouraging International Cooperation

In addition to this general openness of most Horizon 2020 calls to non-EU researchers, many calls particularly encourage cooperation with non-EU partners. All calls are published in bi-annual "Work Programmes" and can be found in the International cooperation topic page.
