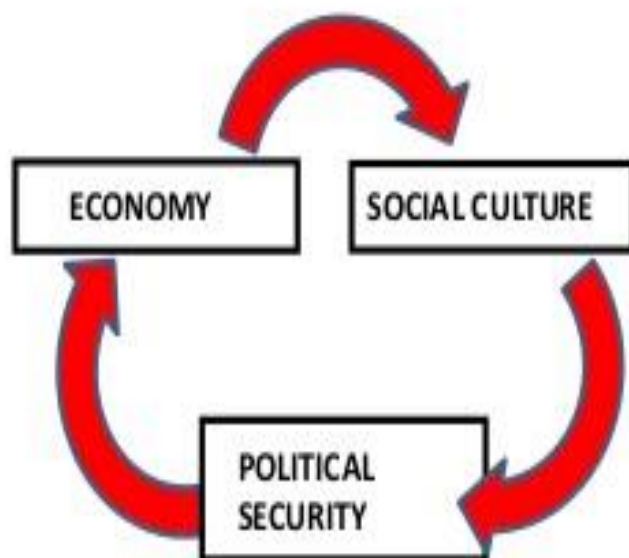
Charter: ASEAN Objectives

PLAN OF ACTION TO PREVENT VIOLENT EXTREMISM

- 15 January 2016 - UN Secretary-General presented a Plan of Action to Prevent Violent to the General Assembly.
- 12 February 2016 -the General Assembly adopted a resolution welcoming the initiative and giving further consideration to the Plan of Action to Prevent Violent Extremism.
- 1 July 2016 - United Nations General Assembly adopted by consensus, resolution reinforcing global consensus in the fight against terrorism and violent extremism and recognized the importance of preventing violent extremism for a Plan of Action to Prevent Violent Extremism, as applicable to the national context.

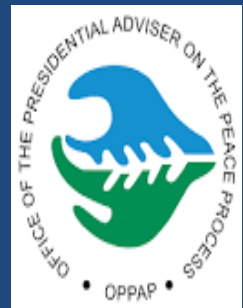
