





Reactions:

We agree more SDG indicators should be captured.

Mobile signal being the only one captured, data driven policy will be hindered by absence of the other SDG indicators, especially fixed line connectivity and devices of individuals and schools.

Though not the largest ICT player, not capturing Cable Tv and internet in the survey would have presented different results and shown that small players can do a lot to help bridge the digital divide.



Possible effects of capturing cable

Industry survey estimates over 5 million cable tv subscribers

Similar surveys estimate cable internet subscribers at 2 million

Impacts on the survey

Likely increase in fiber available per barangay from less than 30% since most cable operators use either FTTN or FTTH

Likely increase in ISPs available. Most subscribers don't call cable companies ISP.

Finally, 91% of homes have a TV 40% receive an analog antenna signal. The 51% of the balance are connected to something, we believe a significant number of that is cable






We support the ways forward.
