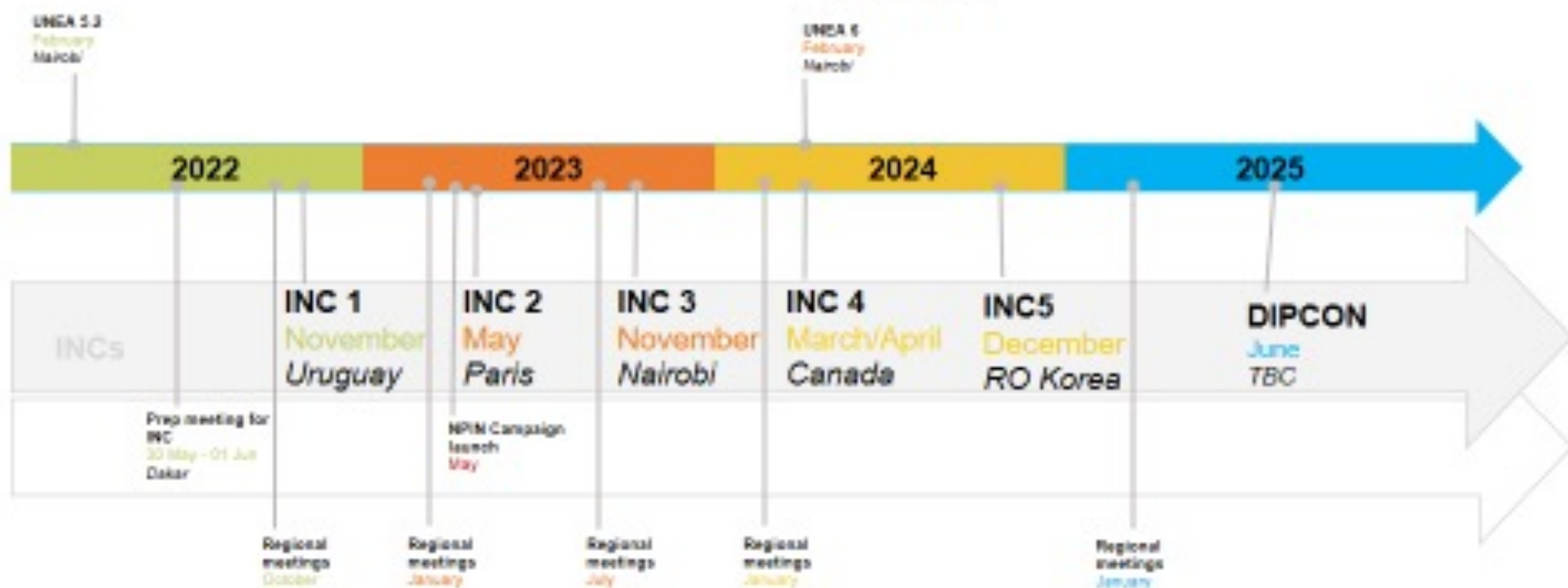

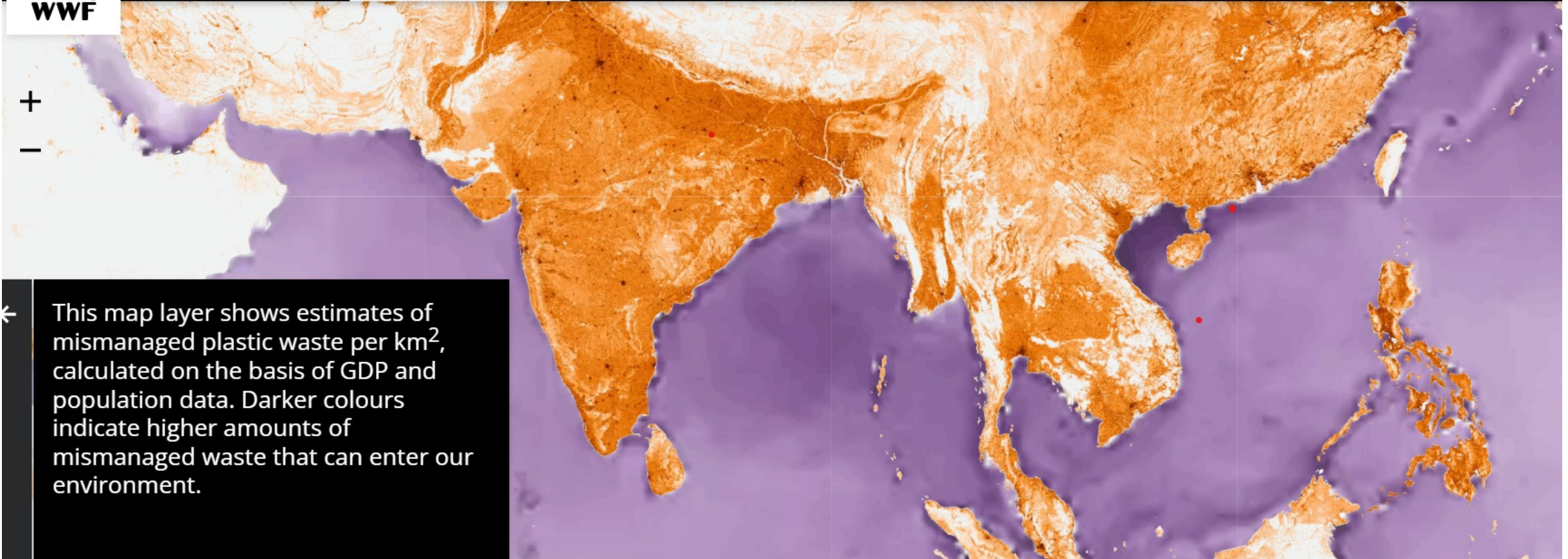
WWF's overall ambition for a global treaty to end plastic pollution

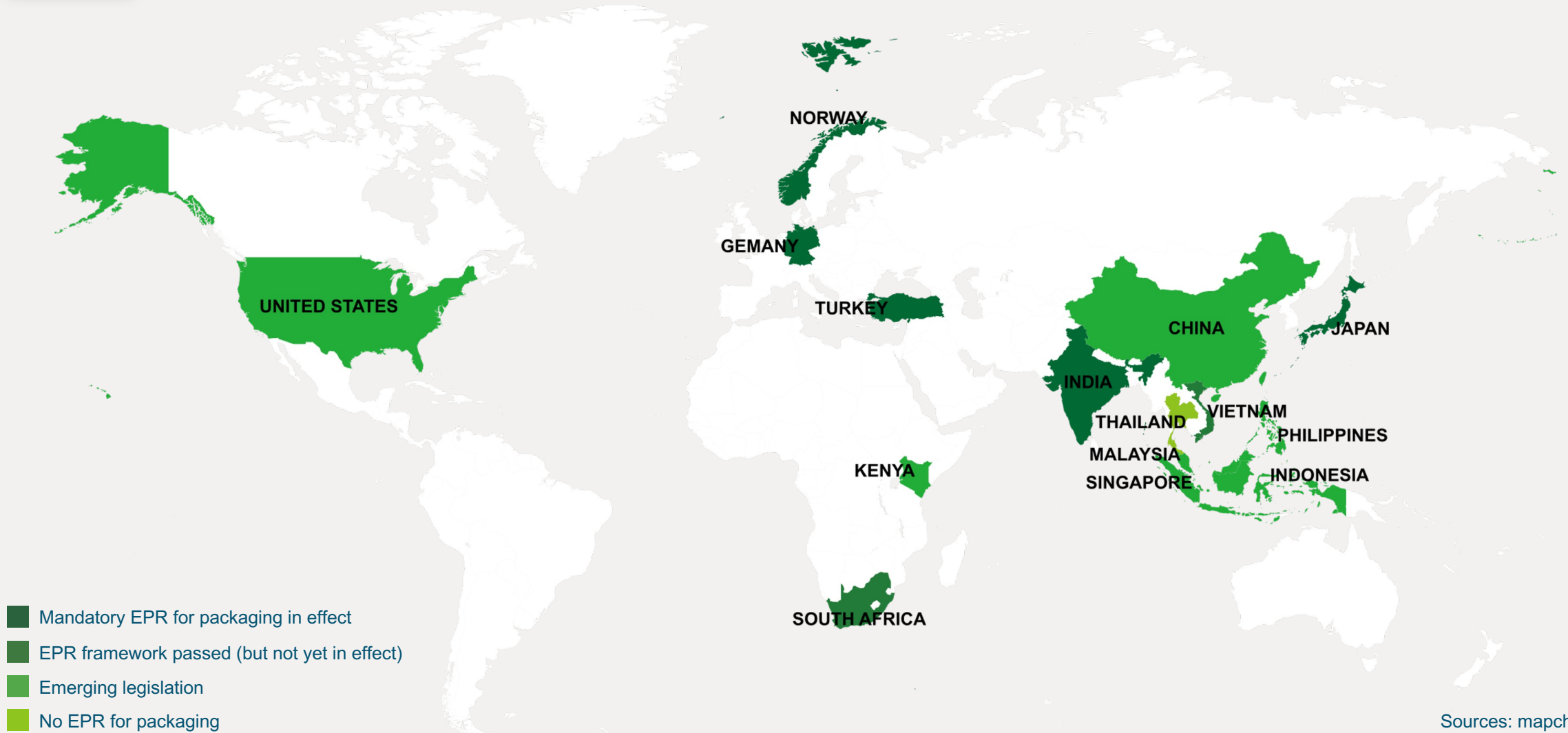


Around **60%** of all mismanaged plastic waste occurs in the **Asia Pacific Region** alone.
